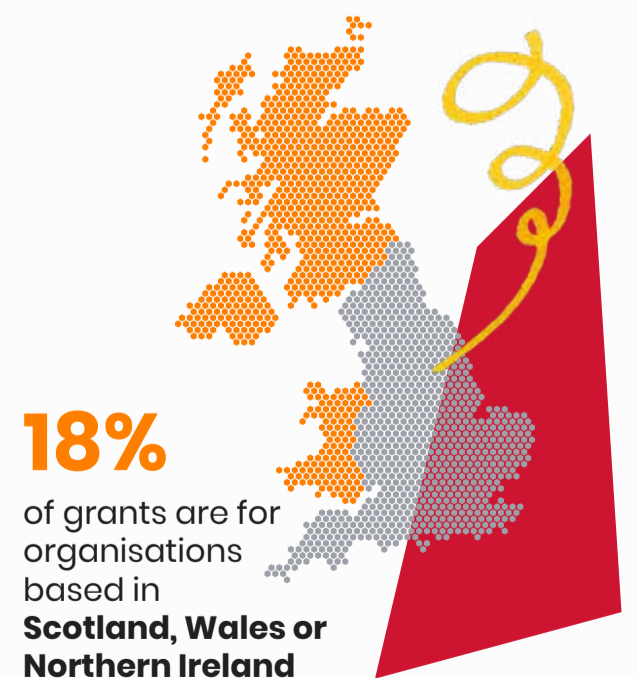
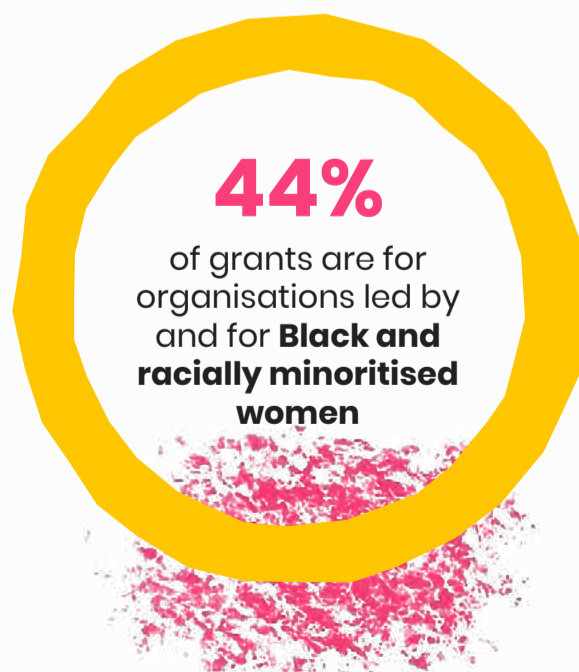
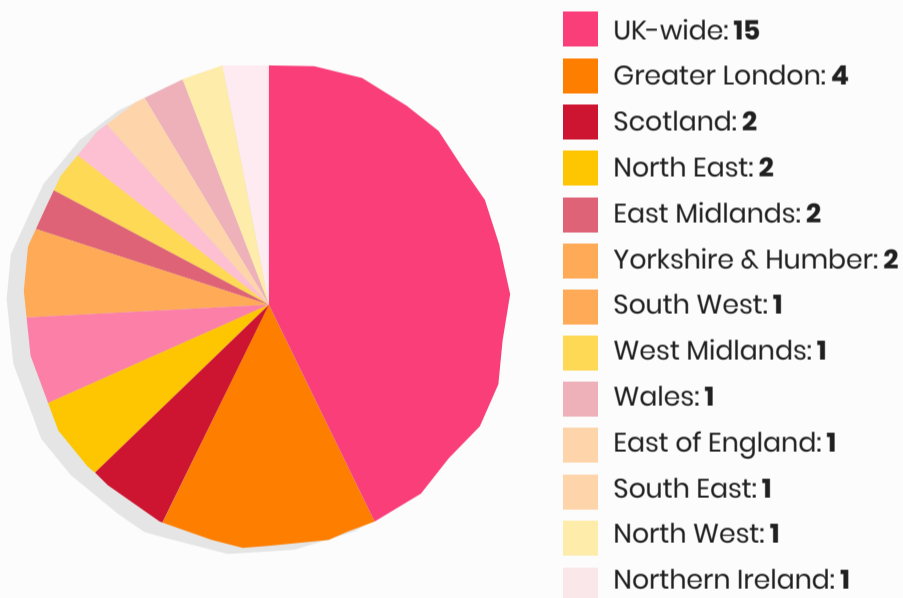

Grant	Location
4M Mentor Mothers was awarded £10,000 to explore support gaps and produce guidance for culturally-sensitive advice for breastfeeding mothers living with HIV.	UK-wide
50:50 was awarded £9920 to run a national survey to expose barriers facing women engaging in the candidate selection process ahead of the 2029 general election.	Greater London
Abi Billingham & Associates was awarded £9301 to influence professionals who work with young women who have been harmed by criminal exploitation, and to support young women to deliver future training themselves.	Greater London
Action on Postpartum Psychosis was awarded £10,000 to develop an awareness-raising campaign targeted at Black and Asian families across the UK, and to influence faith leaders and health professionals to better support them.	UK-wide
AKAYA Foundation was awarded £9700 to support Black girls in London with unseen mental health problems to influence schools, CAHMS and local authorities about inequalities in mental health services.	Greater London
Amma Birth Companions was awarded £10,000 to influence the Scottish Government and Scottish Task Force who are conducting the National Maternity Review, so that they consider pregnant migrant women in services.	Scotland
Apna Ghar Women's Centre was awarded £10,000 to develop a community-led campaign aimed at local service providers, addressing the fear and barriers faced by migrant women trying to access services.	North East
BelEve was awarded £10,000 to run the 'It is That Deep?' campaign, raising awareness of sexual harassment by delivering in-school workshops and training teachers and safeguarding leads.	Greater London
Black Mothers Matter was awarded £10,000 to raise awareness of the disparity in maternal and neonatal experiences of Black women. Its campaign is aimed at policymakers, educators and health leaders.	UK-wide
Bristol Women's Voice was awarded £9639 to campaign for better employment conditions for carers, by working in partnership with unions and carers' groups to influence large employers.	South West
Burton Unity CIC was awarded £10,000 for its campaign 'Her Voice, Her Health', to raise awareness of the inequalities in access to health services for minoritised women. It will influence local authorities, NHS and local voluntary organisations.	East Midlands

<p>Clean Break Theatre Company was awarded £10,000 to make a film highlighting the impact of mothers' separation from their children through imprisonment, which it will show to audiences including MPs and members of the National Women's Justice Coalition.</p>	UK-wide
<p>Ella's Home was awarded £10,000 for a campaign aimed at local authorities and care commissioning groups to improve access to services for female survivors of trafficking.</p>	Greater London
<p>Getaway Girls was awarded £10,000 to run a youth-led campaign addressing racial injustice in schools, including a short film, workshops and meeting school staff.</p>	Yorkshire & Humber
<p>The Gina Project CIC was awarded £9994.32 to train students and produce awareness-raising resources to tackle sexual harassment on university campuses in Birmingham.</p>	West Midlands
<p>IKWRO Women's Rights Organisation was awarded £10,000 for its 'Crime Not Culture' campaign, which will challenge misconceptions about honour-based abuse.</p>	UK-wide
<p>Irise International was awarded £10,000 to pilot its Toilet Policy Toolkit in Special Educational Needs settings, and to engage the Department for Education to advocate for national guidance around school toilet policies.</p>	UK-wide
<p>Middle Eastern Women and Society Organisation (MEWSo) was awarded £10,000 for its 'Break the Silence' campaign. It will bring together women with lived experience of harmful practices and domestic abuse to create educational materials to train professionals for better responses.</p>	UK-wide
<p>The Motherhood Plan was awarded £10,000 to influence the Scottish Government's childcare priorities following the Scottish parliament election.</p>	UK-wide
<p>Muslim Women's Network UK was awarded £10,000 for its campaign to increase reporting of hate crimes against Muslim women, through billboard coverage, a film and workshops.</p>	UK-wide
<p>The Network of International Women for Brighton & Hove was awarded £10,000 to produce a film and training for professionals, aiming to ensure that racially minoritised women experiencing economic abuse can access tailored, language-appropriate support.</p>	South East
<p>North Down & Ards Women's Aid was awarded £9734.13 to create a video and podcast about coercive control.</p>	Northern Ireland
<p>Pause Creating Space for Change was awarded £10,000 to train and support its ambassadors to influence the review of the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill.</p>	UK-wide
<p>Port Talbot and Afan Women's Aid was awarded £10,000 to run an awareness-raising campaign focused on prevention of domestic and sexual violence, aimed at girls.</p>	Wales

<p>Rubies was awarded £10,000 for a campaign around girls' social media safety, focusing on requests for explicit images. It will make a film to show in local schools and youth settings.</p>	<p>North East</p>
<p>Stand Up Sisters CIC was awarded £10,000 to run a local creative campaign raising awareness of women's health inequalities.</p>	<p>North West</p>
<p>Surviving Economic Abuse was awarded £10,000 for its campaign about coerced debt. Surviving Economic Abuse will engage women with lived experience to influence banks, regulators and policymakers.</p>	<p>UK-wide</p>
<p>The Network of International Women for Brighton & Hove was awarded £10,000 to produce a film and training for professionals, aiming to ensure that racially minoritised women experiencing economic abuse can access tailored, language-appropriate support.</p>	<p>South East</p>
<p>Women's Advocacy Network CIC was awarded £10,000 for Black and minoritised women in Wales to share their experiences of maternity care with practitioners and policymakers to highlight disparities in treatment.</p>	<p>UK-wide</p>
<p>Women's Integration Network was awarded £10,000 to campaign against institutional racism faced by migrant mothers interacting with the Scottish child protection system. It will produce a documentary film for parliament and develop training for social workers.</p>	<p>Scotland</p>
<p>Women of Valiance was awarded £10,000 for a campaign about work sponsorship visas, pushing for fairer protections for migrant women. It aims to influence local MPs, the care sector and recruitment agencies.</p>	<p>East of England</p>
<p>WomenZone was awarded £10,000 to campaign against menopause stigma amongst South Asian women. It will recruit women as menopause champions, host workshops, and partner with local healthcare professionals.</p>	<p>Yorkshire & Humber</p>
<p>You My Sister was awarded £10,000 to ensure the voices of women in the sex industry are heard as parliament discusses new legislation about the industry. It will support a Survivor Advocate to meet with MPs, work closely with the All Party Parliamentary Group on prostitution, and host an event in parliament.</p>	<p>UK-wide</p>
<p>Zinthiya Ganeshpanchan Trust was awarded £9980 for a campaign to stop the destitution of female international students attending university in the UK who experience abuse. It will influence universities to implement key safety measures.</p>	<p>East Midlands</p>
